

Class Particulars and Focus

Scheduling training dates: This is a 16 hour training which can be scheduled on any two consecutive days including weekends. Unique schedules available.

Award: All officers completing the training receive a certificate of completion.

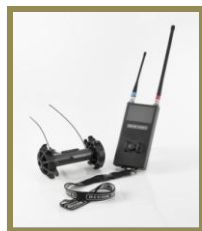


Day two: To say you'll be busy is an understatement. You will start your day

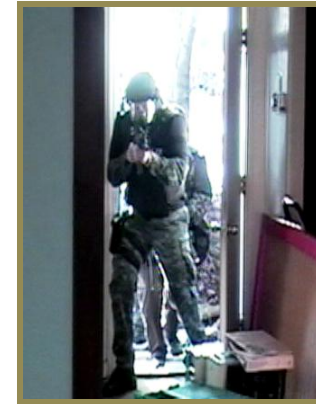
